

# EE WASTE



1. **devices up to 25 cm in size** can be dropped off free of charge at the shops with the sign "EE waste take-back" with no obligation to purchase



2. **larger appliances** can be dropped off free of charge at the shop when you buy new ones



3. drop them off free of charge at the civic amenity site



4. arrange the transport free of charge with a licensed collector (the list of collectors is available at [www.fzoeu.hr](http://www.fzoeu.hr))

# PACKAGING WASTE

Do you know that for beverage packaging larger than **0.2 litres** you can get a deposit fee refund of **0.50 kn**? You can drop off this type of packaging at any shop selling beverages with a surface area larger than **200 m<sup>2</sup>**.



plastic beverage packaging, except for dairy and dairy products



glass beverage packaging,



metal beverage packaging – tin cans

At the civic amenity site (recycling yard) you can drop off other types of packaging, such as wood, textile, cardboard, multilayer (Tetra Pak cartons), or paint and varnish packaging.

# BULKY WASTE



1. drop it off free of charge at the civic amenity site



2. dispose of it free of charge in large containers provided by your utility service



3. arrange the transport in advance in accordance with the set conditions

## Waste tyres

1. drop them off free of charge at the recycling yard
2. drop them off free of charge at the tyre fitting service when you replace them
3. hand them over free of charge to the licensed collector (the list is available at [www.fzoeu.hr](http://www.fzoeu.hr))

# BATTERIES AND ACCUMULATORS



1. drop it off free of charge at the civic amenity site



2. dispose of it free of charge at the shop selling batteries and/or accumulators



3. dispose of batteries in battery containers put up in many public places



4. hand them over free of charge at the car or EE equipment service shop, or the collector (the list of collectors is available at [www.fzoeu.hr](http://www.fzoeu.hr))

# END-OF-LIFE VEHICLES



1. take the end-of-life vehicle to the licensed collector (the list of collectors and instructions on how to hand over the vehicle are available at [www.fzoeu.hr](http://www.fzoeu.hr))



When taking back an integral vehicle with all components (the bodywork and engine are mandatory), the collector pays the fee of 1 kn per kilo of vehicle.
